All students should be in <u>FULL SCHOOL UNIFORM</u> including school shoes. All students who attend mass and visit their homeroom teacher for the open house that follows Mass will be given an out of uniform pass to be used Monday, February 4nd

Monday, January 28, 2019 - Beach Wear

Students will not be in uniform this day. They should wear beach clothing. Hawaiian shirts,
