

Even though the weekend weather is no indication, fall is upon us and October starts Sunday. We hope you all had a wonderful time this past weekend at our Parish Fall Festival. Thank you to all those who volunteered and helped in various ways to make it a wonderful success.

Schools and classrooms have many routines. As part of our lunch routine here at St. John's, students from each grade (1st-8th) are assigned to clean up (wash tables and sweep the floor) after their grade's lunch period. They are doing a wonderful job and learning a great life skill. Hopefully they will volunteer to do the same at home!

Our second collection for the Non-public School Marathon was this past Wednesday. Volunteers will be coming Friday to count, so we don't quite yet know the school-wide total for this week. Students who brought in a total of \$125 will be visiting the SJB snack shack tomorrow following lunch. Our next collection day is Wednesday, October 4th. If students bring or have brought in at least their full total of \$175 they will get to go the snack shack on October 6th. Our total school goal is \$70,000.00. If we reach our goal, the school will have a day off in February. We have an online donation option again this year so family and friends may donate online towards the marathon using the following link: Marathon Donation Link. The Marathon will be held on Saturday, October 7th at Central Park from 8am-1pm. Make sure check in at the "St. John's" pavilion in order to receive your out of uniform pass. Join us for prayer and a walk around the lake at 9am.

Here are some other important October dates:

- Tuesday, October 3rd is the first Non-Uniform for Teachers. Students who bring in \$1.00 or more may come out of uniform on Tuesday, October 3rd. This is a PTO sponsored fundraiser. All money raised is used to provide small teacher appreciation events during the school year like coffee and doughnuts and the remaining benefits student activities (like the end of the year picnics).
- The Non Public School Marathon is Saturday, October 7th at Central Park in Roseville.
- Middle School Sunday Mass with the Parish is Sunday, October 8th at 10:30am. This is wonderful way to celebrate our Catholic faith with our parish community and be of service to them in the liturgy. Please join us for Mass.
- School pictures are October 10th and 11th. More information will be coming out soon. Families should receive information directly from Jostens.
- MEA is Thursday, October 19th and Friday, October 20th. There is no school for all students in grades preschool through grade 8. J-Care (grades K-8) and Preschool Care Crew will be open. See below for more information and directions for registering your students for these school release days.

Volunteering at SJB - Virtus Requirements

As you know, each family commits to 20 hours of volunteering at St. John's over the course of the school year or is assessed a volunteer fee at the conclusion of the school year (this year that fee is \$500). Our goal is to have parent involvement at the school and parish - it is invaluable both to us and to your child and the parish as a whole. In order to volunteer at the school as a field trip chaperone, attending class-room parties, etc., each volunteer must be up to date with their Virtus. All employees, and volunteers who interact with minors, are required to complete the "Essential Three" requirements (which must be renewed every three years) and maintain safe environment credentials through the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. This includes completion of the VIRTUS training as well as submission of the Volunteer Application and a Background Check. To get started on this training, go to the Virtus page of the school website and follow the step-by-step instructions. If you have any questions regarding Virtus, please contact our Virtus Coordinator, Alison Wacek at waceka@stjohnnyb.org.

Over the course of the year as you complete volunteering, please keep track of your hours. You may print and use the <u>Volunteer Tracking Form</u> or keep track in your own way. We will ask for these hours in the spring. Note: Only K-8 parents are required to complete the 20 hours each year, however, preschool parents who volunteer still need to be Virtus trained.

J-Care on School Release Days - MEA



J-Care will be available during MEA break, October 19-20 for students in grades K-8. Cost for each day is \$37 per student if preregistered by 9:00am on Thursday, October 12 (\$47 if after). There is an additional \$10 fee for Thursday, Oct. 19th for the field trip cost.

Please Note the Following Regarding School Release Days:

- Hours of Operation: 7:00am-6:00pm (Hours may be altered based on number of students signed up.)
- Cancellation: If you are signed up for the school release day and cancel within one week of the actual school release day, you will be charged the full amount. No exceptions. You may cancel prior to the one-week window of the school release day. The cancellation must be written and signed by the parent/guardian.
- Lunch is not provided by the school or J-Care on school release days, so please send a lunch with your child(ren). Milk will be provided at no additional charge. If you do not send a lunch with your child (ren), you will be called to bring a lunch.
- Uniforms are not required on school release days.

All students who attend J-Care on school release days, must have a current J-Care registration on file. The registration form may be found on the SJB website and returned to the school office. Find this form and more information about J-Care on our website. 2023-2024 J-Care Information
