## From the Principal

We are settling back into the routine of school after our long Christmas break, but also gearing up for a few busy upcoming weeks. Below are some dates that we want to make sure you are aware of:

- There will be No school tomorrow, Friday, January 12th for a staff workday and on Monday, January 15th for Martin Luther King Jr. Day.
- We will host our 5th grade Faith, Family and Fellowship Morning next Wednesday, January 17th. We invite our 5th grade families to Mass at 8:30am followed by a short presentation by the students and fellowship in St. Joseph Hall. If you haven't sent in your rsvp, please do so <u>HERE</u>.
- The Preschool and Kindergarten Information and Registration Night will be held on Thursday, January 18th from 6-7:30pm. Invite families interested in SJB to attend and learn more about our Preschool and/or Kindergarten and to show them why St. John's is the perfect fit for their family! - There will be NO BUSSING for the MV district buses on Thursday, January 25th and Friday, January 26th. Morning drop off for K-8 students will be at the gym doors by way of 2nd Ave NW from 7:30-7:50am. Blaine buses will run normally on these two days. Afternoon pickup will be from the main Church parking lot at 2:30pm. Preschool drop off and pick up will be the same as normal on these two days.
- We will kick off Catholic Schools Week with the CSW Mass on Sunday, January 28th at 10:30am. The following week will be filled with special activities and dress days for our students. The week will wrap up with Wines to Wishes on Saturday, February 3rd. Look for more information on CSW below.

Re-enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year will open next Friday, January 19th. Current SJB families will receive an email from TADS with information on how to enroll your student(s). Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year will see a \$140 increase per student (2.5%) to help cover the increasing costs of supplies, services, and utilities. For students in grades K-8, Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year will be \$5725 and the Technology Fee will remain at \$225 per student. As we approach the winter testing period for students, we want to inform you of some adjustments to our assessment plan. This season, we will be using DORA (Diagnostic Online Reading Assessment) and ADAM (Adaptive Diagnostic Assessment of Mathematics) instead of NWEA tests. These two assessments provide us with valuable insights into your child's reading proficiency and overall academic growth. We believe this change will enhance our ability to tailor educational strategies to better meet individual student needs. As always, we appreciate your continued partnership in supporting your child's academic journey.
