What is the School Operations Endowment?

St. John the Baptist School Operations Endowment will become a new source of school funding, thanks to the Restore to Gather Campaign (<u>click here</u>). Endowment funds provide a continuous source of income in perpetuity. The principal for this fund will be invested, and the interest earned will be disbursed to the school on an annual basis. This ongoing income will provide benefits such as:

- Subsidize teacher salaries to attract and retain highly qualified staff.
- Provide ongoing maintenance and handle minor repairs.
- Purchase new school equipment and keep technology up-to-date.
- Supply funds for faculty and staff development and continuing education.




Have we reached our goal?
